During her tenure on the Commission from late 2017 to December 2022, she continued to serve in various leadership roles, including the Final Review and Minority Sub-Committees; the Executive Committee; Chair of the Policy Committee; Vice Chair of the Commission and eventually Chair of the MMCC in 2022. Tiffany now serves as co-chair of the Shulman Rogers Cannabis Practice.

After earning her JD from the University of Maryland Francis King Carey School of Law in 2007, Tiffany served as a law clerk for The Honorable Barry G.
