Before focusing her practice on family law, Veronica served as Legislative Counsel to the Council of the District of Columbia, where she led the introduction and passage of the Detained Youth Access to the Juvenile Services Program Amendment of 2019. In that role, she drafted proposed legislation, staffed a Councilmember at hearings, and worked with community organizers, advocates, and the executive branch to shape policy responsive to community needs.

Outside of her practice, Veronica is active in the legal community and committed to expanding access to legal services.
